We hope you will decide to enter and participate in WCRHEA's program to become an accredited teacher of rug hooking. We welcome anyone who has a keen interest in the art and craft of traditional and contemporary rug hooking.

This program was developed in response to the need for trained rug hooking instructors in western Canada. No sponsoring guild structure exists in any of the western Canadian provinces or territories. This gives our organization the freedom to be independent and able to adapt to the changing needs and interests of rug hookers in the west. We honour strong traditional roots but also encourage modern interpretations of the rug hooking medium. WCRHEA also offers a selfstudy professional development program that further assists teachers in their personal, business, and artistic development.

Our program meets the needs of a huge geographical area that includes a wide variety of hooking styles and personalities. The vastness of that geographical area also means that many rug hookers have essentially been on their own in pursuit of their passion of rug hooking. To this end, we attempt to be as inclusive, accessible, and flexible as possible. On-line courses, submission of requirements via highresolution images, and zoom meetings are ways we are as progressive and convenient as we can be, to meet both program and student requirements. We hope to develop in this area so we can take advantage of new technology as it becomes available.

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Western Canada Rug Hooking Education Association Teacher Accreditation Program

Requirements for Admission:

- 1. A minimum of three (3) years hooking experience.
- 2. Active membership in WCRHEA.
- 3. A minimum of three finished rugs. (Rug specifications below)
- 4. Have a sponsor who is willing to support the applicant throughout their training process.
 - The sponsor is a certified instructor. They do not need to be certified by WCRHEA; they could hold certification through another certification program such as OHCG or RHGNS. *
 - Sponsor must have knowledge of the applicant's rug hooking experience and abilities and be willing to take an active role as a mentor throughout the applicant's training.

For Program Entry, Applicants Must Submit:

- 1. Completed Application Form
- 2. WCRHEA Membership form and payment (if not already an active member).
- 3. A letter from trainee's sponsor supporting your application to become a teacher.
 - Letter should indicate that the sponsor sees the applicant's enthusiasm, knowledge and abilities in the art form and that they are willing to take an active role in the trainee's learning in the form of mentorship throughout the accreditation process.
- 4. Submit photos of three completed rugs for assessment by the teacher training committee.
 - Completed rugs must be 12" x 12" or 144 square inches minimum.
 - They may be completed in any cut and include alternative fibres but must be primarily hooked with cut wool strips.
 - Rugs must be finished using three different rug-finishing methods. (Example: Roll forward & whipped; Roll back, whipped with tape, etc.)
 - Submit three clear, high-resolution images of each rug, including:
 - Rug front
 - Rug back
 - Close up of finished edge

Alternately submit completed rugs for in-person assessment at Prairie Harvest Rug Hooking School.

Give a short presentation (10 - 15 min) at the Prairie Harvest Rug Hooking School introducing you and one of your rugs.

 It is strongly suggested that all trainees present in person at PHRHS. However, consideration will be given to request by a trainee to present online via Zoom or another meeting platform. Requests can be made to the WCRHEA Teacher Training Committee via the Education Director. In this case, all WCRHEA members will be invited to participate in the online presentation.

WCRHEA Membership must be maintained during the entire accreditation process
